THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 6

Lisa Wexler, Probate Judge for the Westport/Weston District, will speak about the duties and jurisdiction of the probate court as well as her experiences and initiatives during the past year. She graduated with a BA from The Johns Hopkins University in 1981 and received her JD from the New York University School of Law in 1984. She entered the New York Bar in 1985 and the Connecticut Bar in 1989. She served on Westport's Planning and Zoning Commission and has been active with groups that promote the advancement of women, seek to erase the stigma of sexual assault, and promote screening of newborns for primary immunodeficiency disease. She was elected Probate Judge of Westport/Weston in a special election in November 2013 and is running unopposed for reelection on November 4. She also has an award-winning radio talk show, The Lisa Wexler Show, which airs weekdays 4-6:00PM on AM 1230.

THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 13

Frederic Chiu, a Westport resident, classical pianist, teacher and host of "arts immersion salons," will speak about his life in classical music and his broader activities in the arts that he shares with his wife, sculptor Jeanine Esposito. With a bachelor's degree from the Jacobs School of Music at Indiana University and a master's degree from Juilliard, Mr. Chiu has enjoyed an active career both in Europe and the U.S. With over 20 CDs on the market, his repertoire includes the complete works of Prokofiev as well as popular classics of Chopin and Liszt and lesser-known masterpieces of Mendelssohn and Rossini, with a special place for the piano transcriptions. His innovative workshop program, Deeper Piano Studies, brings together pianists from around the world to study in an environment that encompasses such nontraditional techniques as cooking and learning without using an instrument. He and his wife direct artistic activities at Beechwood Arts, an arts immersion non-profit whose activities include music, sculpture, painting, film, dance and cooking, at their Westport home. Beechwood is also shown via link to "satellite salons" around the world. His is an expansive and inclusive view of artistic expression.
