THURSDAY, JANUARY 8

Eileen Hunt, organist at the Congregational Church in Green's Farms, will give us a history of opera illustrated by recordings of some of her favorite passages. Dr. Hunt holds degrees in organ and musicology from Boston University and has presented piano and organ recitals in Europe and the U.S. She is a keen student and passionate fan of opera, familiar with many of the great opera houses of the world, who enlivens her presentations on opera with her exuberant enthusiasm for the art.

THURSDAY, JANUARY 15

Writer, artist, naturalist and angler James Prosek will talk on what he has learned from a lifetime (he's 39) of the acute observation of fish, eels, birds and other denizens of the outdoors that underlies his watercolor painting. He published his first book of watercolors, Trout: An Illustrated History, when he was an undergraduate at Yale. His Ocean Fishes: Painting of Saltwater Fish, came out in 2014. His art and writings reflect how his craft has led him to a deep appreciation of the profound richness and variability of nature.

THURSDAY, JANUARY 22

Jeffrey Immelt, Chairman of the Board and CEO of GE, will speak on what he has been doing at GE and what he sees as challenges for the economy and the country going forward. A graduate of Dartmouth College and Harvard Business School, Mr. Immelt joined GE in 1982 and succeeded Jack Welch as CEO and Chairman of the Board in 2001. He also served as Chairman of the Business Council in 2005 and 2006 and Chairperson of the President's Council on Jobs and Competitiveness from February 2011 to January 2013.

THURSDAY, JANUARY 29

Kevin Keenan, Chief Operating Officer and General Counsel of the NAACP Legal Defense and Education Fund ("LDF"), will speak on the history and current activities of the LDF. A graduate of Swarthmore College and Yale Law School, Mr. Keenan worked for various ACLU affiliates in New Jersey, Nevada and California, helped human rights reform efforts in Belfast, Northern Ireland and monitored elections in the former Yugoslavia before joining LDF in 2013. Founded in 1940 under the leadership of Thurgood Marshall, LDF has been a leading civil and human rights law firm.
