THURSDAY, APRIL 2

Senator Chris Murphy will talk on what he has learned from his two-plus years in the U.S. Senate, what he has accomplished, the effort to get things done in Washington and what his priorities are going forward. A graduate of Williams College and UConn School of Law in Hartford, Senator Murphy served for eight years in the Connecticut General Assembly (four in the House and four in the Senate) before his election to the U.S. House of Representatives in 2006, representing Connecticut's Fifth Congressional District, covering Danbury to Waterbury. In 2012, he defeated Republican Linda McMahon to be elected Connecticut's Junior Senator in Washington.

THURSDAY, APRIL 9

Staples grad Matt Davies, a Pulitzer Prize-winning cartoonist at Newsday, will talk on the art and practicalities of his craft, how he shapes his commentary to the local and national environment and survival of the editorial cartoonist in an age of decline and transformation for newspapers. Mr. Davies studied at the Savannah College of Arts and Design (GA) and the School of Visual Arts in NYC. He worked for The Journal News in Westchester County, NY, the Hearst Connecticut Newspaper Group and the nonprofit online policy journal Remapping Debate.org before joining Newsday in 2014. Mr. Davies won a Pulitzer Prize for Editorial Cartooning and a Herblock Prize in 2004, was a 2011 Pulitzer Prize Finalist and has won numerous other awards for his cartoons. His work appears widely in newspapers and magazines. He also writes and illustrates children's books.

THURSDAY, APRIL 16

Foster Hirsch, Professor of Cinema at Brooklyn College, will talk on movies of the 1950's, when Brando made the scene, Elizabeth Taylor grew up and the screen widened. Armed with M.F.A., M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from Columbia University, Professor Hirsch joined the English Department of Brooklyn College in 1967 and the college's newly established Film Department in 1973, where he still teaches. He has written about 20 books on theatre and cinema, including Film Noir: The Dark Side of the Screen (1983), A Method to Their Madness: The History of the Actor's Studio (1984) and Otto Preminger: The Man Who Would Be King. (2007). He is a thoughtful, prolific and energetic analyst of and enthusiast for the world of American cinema.

THURSDAY, APRIL 23

Julia Sweig, former Nelson and David Rockefeller senior fellow for Latin America Studies and director for Latin America Studies at the Council on Foreign Relations, will speak on Cuba and U.S.-Cuba relations. Dr. Sweig holds a B.A. from University of California and an M.A. and Ph.D. from The Johns Hopkins University School of Advanced International Studies. She spent nearly 16 years with the Council on Foreign Relations where she established a reputation as an eminent scholar of international relations in the Americas. She is the author of Cuba: What Everyone Needs to Know (2009, 2013), Friendly Fire: Losing Friends and Making Enemies in the Anti-American Century (2006) and numerous publications on Latin

America and American foreign policy. Her Inside the Cuban Revolution: Fidel Castro and the Urban Underground (2002) received the American Historical Association's Herbert Feis Award for best book of the year by an independent scholar.

THURSDAY, APRIL 30

Westport resident Anthony Banbury, United Nations Assistant Secretary General for Field Support, will speak on his recent experience heading up the UN Mission for Ebola Emergency Response as well as other UN-related activities in the world's troubled regions. A graduate of Tufts University (B.A., political science) and the Tufts Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy (M.A.), Mr. Banbury's early career at the UN took him to Thailand, Cambodia, Bosnia-Herzegovina and Croatia. He also worked as an advisor on the Balkans in the Office of the Secretary of Defense (1997-1999) and at the National Security Council in the White House (2000-2003). He served as the Asia Regional Director for the World Food Program in Bangkok (2003-2009) managing humanitarian relief and development operations in 14 countries before taking on his current job as UN Assistant Secretary General for Field Support covering a broad range of missions.
