THURSDAY, OCTOBER I

Ken Roman is the former chairman of Ogilvy & Mather Worldwide, the agency founded by David Ogilvy. He joined the firm in 1963 as an assistant account manager and rose to become Chairman/CEO from 1985 to 1989. After the takeover by WPP Group plc in 1989, he joined American Express as Executive Vice President and then became a senior advisor to Price Waterhouse and a board director at Compaq, Brunswick and Gartner.

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 8

Robert J. "Bobby" Valentine assumed the role of executive director of athletics at Sacred Heart University in June 2013. He grew up in Stamford where he was the only three-time All-State football player in state history at Rippowam High School. Bobby spent 10 seasons in the major leagues, playing for the Dodgers, San Diego Padres, California Angels, Mets and Seattle Mariners. He made his major league managerial debut in 1985 with the Texas Rangers, earning UPI American League Manager of the Year honors in 1986. Valentine took over the Mets in 1996 and led the squad to back-to-back post-seasons, including a 2000 World Series appearance. Since 1980, he has owned and operated Bobby Valentine's Sports Gallery Cafe, located in his hometown of Stamford. Valentine is married to Mary Branca, the daughter of former Brooklyn Dodgers pitcher Ralph Branca, and they have a son, Bobby Jr.

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 15

The Y's Men's speaker and performer for October 15, Paul Bogaev, is an award-winning music director, arranger, conductor and composer. He received his first Grammy for Elton John and Tim Rice's Aida, for which he produced, orchestrated and conducted the Tony award-winning score. His second Grammy was as executive producer of the soundtrack of the Oscar-winning film musical Chicago. He served as music director of three ABC-TV film musicals, Rogers and Hammerstein's Cinderella, Annie and South Pacific. He has worked with Barbra Streisand, Sting, Phil Collins, Toni Braxton, Jennifer Hudson, Eddie Murphy, Catherine Zeta-Jones and Sophia Loren.

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 22

Dr. Irwin J. Lebish has been a practicing veterinarian since 1954 and joined the medical staff of the Schulhof Animal Hospital of Westport in 2004. He entered Fordham University in 1945 where he earned a B.S. degree in Pharmacy and in 1954 he received his D.V.M. from the College of Veterinary Medicine at Cornell University. Dr. Lebish is a member of the

American Veterinary Medical Association and the American College of Veterinary Pathologists, has Board Certification in Pathology, and served in the U.S. Army Veterinary Corps.

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 29

Judith Marks-White, prior to becoming an independent free-lance writer, was employed at Time Inc. Her work soon evolved into humorous writing. In 1985, she joined the staff of the Westport News writing the column "In Other Words" which has appeared for the past twenty-nine years. "Seducing Harry" was her debut novel. Her second novel "Bachelor Degree" received Elle Magazine's Reader's Prize Award.
