At the end of the day we collected around 300 shopping bags, which we conservatively estimate to have a value of \$6,000 to \$8,000. what you are doing." Then he pointed to the white bread bag under his arm and said, "This is for me."

Thanks to Callie Jayne of Person-to-Person's food pantry who organized the tables and delivery truck schedules, Barbara Pearson-Rac who runs the amazing Make A Difference Day and the management of Stop & Shop, who let us use their facility and never complained when our piles of stuff blocked the cart path.
