THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 4

Judge Alan Nevas will talk about his participation in the infamous *Pardue Brothers* case. Judge Nevas, a retired Senior United States District Court Judge, serves as an arbitrator and mediator in a broad range of commercial disputes. He also counsels clients on complex litigation and pre-litigation strategy issues. In 1985 Judge Nevas was appointed to the United States District Court for the District of Connecticut by President Reagan. He held that position until retiring in 2009. From 1971 to 1977, Judge Nevas served as the elected State Representative from Westport in the Connecticut General Assembly. Judge Nevas and his wife reside in Westport.

Peter Van Heerden, Executive Director of the *Quick Center for the Arts* will discuss his vision for future programs at the *Quick Center*. He was formerly the Executive Director of the *Westport Arts Center*. Prior to that position he was senior faculty member in performance studies for 15 years at *City Varsity School of Media and Creative Arts* in Cape Town, South Africa.

THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 18

Andrew H. Banoff will discuss services for Alzheimer's and related dementia illnesses. He is the President and CEO of *Jewish Senior Services* which has a 360-bed skilled nursing facility and an operating budget of \$55 million – the second largest in Connecticut. He previously served as the Executive Vice President of *St. Vincent's Health Services* – a 391-bed acute care teaching hospital in Bridgeport. He lives in Trumbull with his wife Karen and has two adult children, Rebecca and Benjamin.

THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 25

This week's speaker is noted film and theater critic **Susan Granger.** She also has worked extensively doing speech and presentation coaching for top management and executives in several industries. Born into a film business family and raised in Hollywood, she appeared as a child actress in movies with *Abbott & Costello, Red Skelton, Lucille Ball,* and *Lassie.* Her education included studying journalism with Pierre Salinger at Mills College and a B.A. in journalism from the University of Pennsylvania. Our favorite critic will give us some perspective on this controversial time for the Oscars and her opinion on who this year's winners might be.

FREE TAX PREP & E-FILING FEDERAL & STATE

The IRS/AARP provides a tax preparation service at no charge in Westport during the February to mid-April tax season.
