After working in professional theater, David returned to Westport in 1992 to direct the Bedford Junior High School theater program. He took over the Staples Theater Department and The Players in 2000. He will bring several of his students to our meeting so we can see what he does and how well he does it.

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 27

Ken Bernhard has addressed the Y's Men on two earlier occasions, one being about his conservation efforts in Africa with the Kenyan Wildlife Service. This time, Ken will speak about the Syria Fund, a not for profit organization that he helped organize last year in order to assist Syrian Refugees in Jordan. Asked about why he formed such a group, he replied that he wanted to try to bring a

little sanity to a crazy part of the world. Ken has served as Westport's Third Selectman and was Town Attorney for three administrations as well as a State Representative.
