Nothing may be quite as timely as the plight of immigrants and refugees. Claudia Connor, president and CEO of the *International Institute of Connecticut*, a Bridgeport based non-profit that assists in settling and assisting immigrants and refugees, is especially qualified to help us understand the complexities of the problem. Claudia is an attorney who has more than 25 years of world-wide experience in legal representation and human rights advocacy. She has held leadership positions with *Save the Children*, the *International Rescue Committee*, *UNICEF* and other organizations. She began her career with the *Legal Aid Society* in New York City.

Y's Man Marty Yellin worked for many years on the Hubble Space Telescope at *Perkin-Elmer* in Danbury. He will give an update of the latest findings from the Telescope with emphases on the recent discoveries of many exo-planets that seem to have the conditions for life of some kind. There will also be an overview of the latest in Black Holes including the first ever picture of a Black Hole swallowing a star like the Sun. Marty served as president of the Y's Men in 2014-2015.

Jim Himes represents Connecticut's 4th District in the United States House of Representatives where he is serving his fifth term. He is a member of the House Committee on Financial Services, serves as the ranking member of the NSA and Cybersecurity Subcommittee of the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence, and is Chair of the New Democrat Coalition. He attended Harvard and was a Rhodes Scholar at Oxford. Jim began his professional career at *Goldman Sachs & Co.* where he worked his way up to Vice President over the course of a 12-year career.

Neighborhood Studios delivers arts education to children at risk and those with special needs throughout Fairfield County. A full-time champion of the arts, Executive Director Frank Derico will tell us how his organization manages 14 school year programs and four summer camps that serve 1500 students with arts education each year.
