All Good Things Must Come To An End

After many years of absorbing the costs of increased rental, increasingly sophisticated programs and more varied activities, to maintain momentum Y's Men of Westport/Weston will add a few dollars to its annual membership dues.

Starting July 1, 2019, annual dues for **new members** will be \$80.00, payable on the date of joining. Annual dues for **returning members** will be \$70.00, payable on or before October 31. If unpaid on that date, the amount will rise to \$80.00, due on or before December 1. A returning member whose dues remain unpaid on December 1 will be dropped from the club's rolls.

New Y's Men and returning Y's Men 90 years of age and older will continue to be exempt from paying annual dues, and are welcome for as long as they like. Each should, however, complete and return a membership form.

Orin Grossman Opens Our New Season With a Music Lesson on September 5th

As Clark Kent, Dr. Grossman enjoyed a more than 40 year academic career at Fairfield University. He retired as its Academic Vice President, and today is Emeritus Professor of Visual and Performing Arts.

As Superman, he graduated Magna from Harvard, earned a Ph.D. in Music at Yale, then built a long second career, touring the globe as an entertainer and, ever the teacher, as an interpreter of some of America's most notable music.

He will play 100 years of American music history for our group, from two of America's early jazz giants, Louis Armstrong and Duke Ellington, on to 1930's swing, to 1940's bebop, to today, pulling together Scott Joplin's ragtime, Zez Confrey's novelty piano, Jelly Roll Morton's Dixieland, and James P. Johnson's stride piano into contemporary jazz — America's Classical music.

We will meet for coffee and donuts between 9:00 a.m. and 9:45 a.m. as usual downstairs in Hoskins Hall. Please plan to be seated in the sanctuary by 10:00 a.m. for our business meeting followed at 10:30 a.m. by Dr. Grossman's presentation.
