Jack Cavanaugh, a veteran sportswriter, radio newsman and author, has tackled the national pastime and its effect on the war effort in his new book, Season of '42: Joe D, Teddy Ballgame, and Baseball's Fight to Survive a Turbulent First Year of War. Season of '42 is much more than a recap of a memorable baseball season. Cavanaugh explores the landing of four German saboteurs on a beach in the "Hamptons" section of Long Island during a June evening in 1942, and the quick thinking of a young Coast Guardsman named John Cullen that ultimately led to their apprehension.

Arthur Levitt, Jr. (born February 3, 1931) After sixteen years on Wall Street, Levitt became the Chairman of the American Stock Exchange (AMEX) in 1978. He later became the twenty-fifth and longest-serving Chairman of the United States Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) from 1993 to 2001. Since May 2001 he has been employed as a senior adviser at the Carlyle Group. Levitt also serves as a policy advisor to Goldman Sachs and as a Director of Bloomberg LP, parent of Bloomberg News. Levitt graduated Phi Beta Kappa from Williams College in 1952.

He has spent some two-thirds of his career creating programs; one-third in academe, teaching at Harvard, Columbia and NYU; and lecturing on cruise ships, serving as a consultant and writing from time to time. He began his career as a page at NBC in New York where, in six years, he worked with many of the greats in the Golden Age of Television; Sid Caesar, Carl Reiner, Neil Simon. He is just completing his memoir: "A Filmmaker's Journal," which as an EBOOK, has embedded in it short excerpts from 22 of his documentaries.
