Dr. Fanton currently serves as Interim Director of the Roosevelt House Public Policy Institute at Hunter College which is dedicated to innovative approaches to teaching, research, and public programming.

He practices clinically in the emergency department and is an assistant clinical professor in the Department of Traumatology and Emergency Medicine at the University of Connecticut School of Medicine.
